Our History

Healing Journeys was founded as a 501 (c)(3) in 1994. To achieve our mission, we offer a free two-day program entitled Cancer as a Turning Point, From Surviving to ThrivingTM. Between March 1994 and July 2005, we produced this event 19 times.

Since 1996, when we began offering the conference free-of-charge, attendance has grown more than 600 percent - from an average of 150 attendees in 1994/95 to an average of 1350 attendees at our last two California conferences and 850 in other states.

Services Provided in 2005

- In April, we partnered with UCSF to provide a special two-day program for health professionals entitled *Cancer and Healing: Innovative Theories and Practices of Psychosocial Support.* One- hundred-fifty (150) physicians, nurses, counselors and social workers attended and gave the program excellent evaluations. Our wonderful professional advisors, including Marty Rossman, MD, Jeff Kane, MD, Rachel Remen, MD, and Marion Weber donated their services so that we could use the meeting proceeds to support Healing Journeys.
- We held our first East Coast conference in Greenville, South Carolina and met 791 new friends who came from 24 states, Canada and Jamaica. Local fundraising and organizing was led by Robin Davenport who had attended the Seattle conference in 2003 and wanted to share the magic with her community. The following groups were represented in the audience of our South Carolina 2005 conference:

• Instead of offering our conference in Hawaii, we were able to support and assist The Turning Point Cancer Center in Honolulu to offer a free Hawaii Cancer Lecture Series, using some of the same speakers we would have used at a conference. The first one, held in September and featuring Jeremy Geffen, MD, was attended by 300 people and was very well received.

Our Plans for 2006

Seattle

- Gary Malkin, seven-time Emmy Award-winning composer and co-creator of the book and CD set, Graceful Passages: A Companion for Living and Dying.
- **Sista Monica**, international recording artist and songwriter whose experience with a rare type of cancer, synovial sarcoma, has transformed her music into a ministry of faith, hope, and courage.
- Mark Nepo, author of *The Exquisite Risk* and *The Book of Awakening*, cancer survivor and a teacher of poetry and spirituality.
- Jonna Tomases, performing artist, three time cancer survivor, and creator of the drama entitled Jonna's Body, Please Hold.
- One World Taiko performing the traditional Japanese drumming used for healing, followed by audience participation in the drumming experience.

Strengthening

Our Financial Foundation

Strategies implemented in 2005 for strengthening our financial foundation

- After losing money on each of our 2004 conferences, we decided to proceed with plans for a conference only if adequate sponsorship was available. Based on this decision, we didn't offer a California conference in 2005, and we cancelled our plans for both Fresno and Hawaii in 2006
- Developed and implemented a fee-based workshop for health professionals.
- Reduced rent expense by relocating to a home office.
- Eliminated the full time administrative assistant position.
- Vacated our paid half time administrative assistant position and budgeted to refill this position in 2006.
- Increased our Board of Directors by three new individuals for a total of 9 members from 4 states (California, Oregon, Washington, and Illinois).

Our Vision Beyond 2006

- Offer *Cancer as a Turning Point, From Surviving to Thriving*TM conference at Furman University, Greenville, SC June 23 & 24, 2007.
- Produce our first Midwest conference We are currently working with an interested group in Milwaukee. WI.
- Offer the next Northwest conference in Portland, OR (2008).
